

Pontoon Usage Rules

1. If staying on Pontoon for more than 5 minutes it is necessary to register in the Pontoon Book. Maximum stay 48 hours for carrying out work on the boat. Pontoon diary to be kept next to notice board at all times.
2. To register write name of boat, responsible person's name and mobile no. and approx. hour intending to moor at Pontoon. A responsible person must be present at the Club whilst boat on Pontoon. If necessary to leave for the ship chandlery (maximum period 30 minutes) have mobile so you can be contacted.
3. If a skipper has been booked on the Pontoon more than twice in a calendar month then they will stand aside if requested by another skipper who has not used the Pontoon.
4. The Pontoon is primarily for the use of Club members. Visiting yachts must register and are restricted to 24 hours.
5. The Pontoon should be available at all time for a member's boat to pick up or drop off crew. If 2 boats are moored on the Pontoon then the 2nd boat registered has to be prepared to leave the Pontoon whilst pick up or drop off occurs.
6. There is to be no berthing on race days until 30 minutes after the last boat is in. On Wednesdays (between 12 pm to 7.00 pm the Pontoon is only available for the purpose of picking up and dropping off guests. Guests are to be ready to embark so that time on Pontoon is not to be more than 5 minutes.
7. The Club reserve the right to move a vessel if the conditions mentioned above are not adhered to.

Dinghy's may be parked on the Club's pontoon as long as the following policies are followed;

- Person parking the dinghy is in attendance at the Club at all times.
- Dinghy's may be parked on the back side of the pontoon at any time.
- Bottom line is that dinghy's should NEVER impede the use of the Pontoon by the use of a Members Yacht or motor boat at any time. The existence of the Pontoon is for the convenience of our Members Yachts and Motor Boats pulling up to prepare or pack down from cruising or racing and small maintenance jobs.

Any breach of these conditions may result in the removal of this particular Member privilege.
